Species may be visible over a period of days to several weeks. Notes: While there are always exceptions, these are generally when a bird is expected to be present. The checklist follows a taxonomic order used in many field guides. It has been pared down to display local birds for a beginner to intermediate level. There are certainly more birds to be seen locally at a more advanced level!
