Our team contributed to the City's first Climate Action Plan and served on various climate stakeholder groups, with expertise developed through leadership training with Al Gore's Climate Reality program.







BurlingtonGreen was able to navigate a difficult year due to our continued ability to operate impactful programming during the Covid-19 pandemic.

After ending 2019 with a small loss, our charity closed 2020 with a \$147K surplus, primarily due to our proactive efforts reducing staff capacity/costs, as well as receiving support from the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy.

Our cash position improved in the year due to a healthy Deferred Revenue balance on hand as well as a one-time CEBA Loan of \$40K. The year-end surplus will be essential to fund charitable activities during 2021 where we have significantly reduced committed grant funds on the horizon.

Our external auditor is BLR LLP, who issued an unmodified opinion on the fiscal year 2020 financial statements. BurlingtonGreen also has a Board Treasurer and active Finance and Audit Committee overseeing and guiding our financial planning, monitoring and reporting.
